#### Dear Friends,

In St Matthew's Gospel Jesus says, '...Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.' Matt. 25:34b-36

In the months of October and November St Luke's Church gives us the opportunity to concentrate on at least two of these things: namely, feeding the hungry and looking after the sick.

The first is our annual Harvest Festival in thanksgiving to God for all his blessings to us. No matter the circumstances of our lives surely it is easy to come up with a long list of things for which we are thankful to God; and we show our gratitude best when we are generous to others in turn.

This letter is your invitation to come and join our Harvest Festival Service at 10.30am on Sunday 6th October. We hope once again to collect and display food produce which later will be distributed via the Food Bank to needy people throughout the area.

Although fresh produce is still welcome for decoration purposes it would be helpful if donations of food were mainly of the tinned or packet type so that they would have a reasonable shelf life. Later in the month (18th) is the celebration of St Luke the Evangelist, the author of the third gospel and the book of Acts – and also our Patronal Festival. St Paul says in his letter to the Colossians that Luke was a physician and traditionally prayers for the sick are made a feature of his celebration. Therefore, on 20th October, the nearest Sunday, our monthly BCP Holy Communion Service at 6pm will be followed by a time of ministry in Bold Chapel where we will offer anointing and prayers for healing to any who ask. Please pass this information around and encourage any who need prayer to come. On 3<sup>rd</sup> November we shall be praying for the healing of those who suffer the heartache of being bereaved - this is the nearest Sunday to the traditionally named All Souls Day (on 2<sup>nd</sup>). At 6pm there will be a special service sometimes called 'The Commemoration of the Faithful Departed'. Families of those whose funerals have taken place over the last year will be invited to attend. The service, of course, is for all who want to give thanks for departed loved ones, no matter how long ago or recently they died. Please come and help us to give thanks as we read out the names of our departed loved ones. There will be a list in church for names to be read out. There will also be an opportunity to hear those names read out at the 9.30am Holy Communion Service on Wednesday 30th October. Of course, it is always a pleasure to welcome you to church every Sunday but please make a special effort to come and join us for these special occasions. May God continue to bless us and give us cause to be grateful, Bob

#### **MOTHERS' UNION**

Welcome back to our autumn term. I need to do a bit of time travel first. Back to July 19th and our outing to Grappenhall Heys. It was a wet day unfortunately. The head gardener met us at the gate for a tour of the grounds. As it was raining and a few members were unable to do the walk he did a talk in the community café. In 1830 Thomas Parr, a wealthy banker and owner of the sugar refinery, established his home and estate of 150 acres at Grappenhall Heys. He begueathed Parr Hall to Warrington. After the war in 1951 Henry Parr sold the estate to Pickfords. It was left empty to fall into disrepair. The walled garden was saved and transformed back to its former glory. They had the greenhouses restored and a community room and café installed from Lottery Funds. The head gardener is the only one who is paid, it's all run by volunteers. They hold horticultural & art workshops and hands-on workshops for school groups. At 1-00 we were treated

friendly manner made everyone feel at ease. The MU flags were paraded and Revd. Bob greeted everyone. Year 5 and 6 pupils made a splash at Everton Park swimming pool whilst competing in the Merseyside Game. The team won 'Spirit of the Games' award, something they could be really proud of. The new Early Years Foundation Stage classes [Reception] are settling well into school life with their teachers Miss Dalziel and Miss Picton. We will be welcoming them into the St Luke's family when they come to church at 9.30am Thursday October 24<sup>th</sup> with their Y6 Buddies and hope parents, grandparents and carers will join us too.

Notes from the belfry

Members of the congregation attending Church during September will have noticed that on a few Sundays there has been no ringing of the bells to greet them, and that the clock is stuck at 3.05. We have no control over the clock, which appears to



be due to an electrical fault. I can only apologise for the lack of bells on a Sunday morning which has been due to holiday absences. For several months we have been struggling to find even 4 ringers out of a need for 6 on Sunday mornings. This month it has been even worse and we have expected to be down to 2 or 3, so ringing has been cancelled. Likewise Tuesday evening practices have also been cancelled for the same reason. And this inability to perform our service comes after we received such favourable comments from many people who attended Reverend Bob's Licencing. It was great to hear such positive comments and to be able to tell people about bells and bell ringing. We did intend to have a presence during Heritage Day but we found it impossible to find enough ringers to make it worthwhile. There would not have been sufficient Farnworth ringers and our colleagues from other towers, on whom we rely at times of need, where engaged in ringing for several weddings on that day. In order to ensure that our bells continue to sound out over Farnworth we do require more volunteers to learn the art. We should be back to having practices on Tuesday evenings during October. Volunteers would be very welcome!

Treasurer's Report, General Fund period Jan - Aug 2019

Receipts £73430.37 Expenses £92303.06 = Deficit £18,872.69

The above figures up to the end of August 2019, include the fees due to the diocese from weddings and funerals in church and also at the crematorium. Looking back at the figures in the last magazine this amount was not included as I was awaiting the funeral list to check details. Please accept my apologies for this oversight. The total amount due to the Diocese for this year so far, amounts to just under £4,000, hence the reason for the sharp increase in the deficit this time. This is in addition to our annual Parish Share of £82,111.68.

For your information

the additional fees payable to the Diocese are :Weddings £207, Funerals in church followed by
Crematorium £134, and funerals just at the Crematorium
£165. In the case of funerals, if the service has been
conducted by a reader or retired clergy then they are
entitled to 50% of the Diocese fee.

The amount payable to the church is :- Weddings £248, funerals in church £89, funerals at the crematorium £30. In addition to this, for each service held in church, a verger's fee is charged of £45, but none of the vergers take this money, they leave it in church funds.



General Data Protection Controller Margaret Campbell 0151 424 6039.

St Luke's Parochial Parish Council (PCC) and Cronton Mission have appointed Margaret Campbell to the above post. St Luke's and Cronton Mission have agreed a data protection policy in line with new regulations and Diocesan guidance. At the present time all appropriate data is being collected from the congregation, PCC, Sunday Club, Toddler Church and Messy Church and permission for photographs of church events, all weddings, funeral and baptisms. All data is stored in a safe place, locked cabinet in St Luke's vestry.

**General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)**

Specifically, we retain electoral roll data while it is

still current; gift aid declarations and associated paperwork for up to <u>6 years</u> after the calendar year to which they relate; and parish registers (baptism, marriages, and funerals) permanently

Handled in a way that ensures appropriate security, including protection against unlawful or unauthorised processing, access, loss destruction or damage

Your rights Under the Data Protection Act 2018, you have the right to find out information the government and other organisations store about you. These include the right to:

Be informed about how your data is being used

**Access personal data** 

Have incorrect data updated

Have data erased

Stop or restrict the processing of you data

Data portability (allowing you to get and reuse your data for different services

Object to how your data is processed in certain circumstances

What is the legal basis for processing your personal data?

Explicit consent of the data subject so that we can keep you informed about news, events, activities and services and process your gift aid donations and keep you informed about both Church and diocesan events.

There is no disclosure to a third party without consent.

Sharing your personal data.

Your personal data will be treated as strictly confidential and will only be shared with other members of the church in order to carry out a service to other church members or for the purpose connected with the church.

We will only share your data with third parties outside of the parish with your consent.

Further processing.

If we wish to use your personal data for a new purpose, not covered by this Data Protection Notice, then we will provide you with a new notice explaining this new use prior to commencing the processing and setting out the relevant purposes and processing conditions. Where and whenever necessary, we will seek your consent to the new processing.


