





All Souls' Day is usually celebrated on 2
November; this day is set aside for remembering and honouring the dead. In Mexico every year, on November 1st (All Saints Day) and 2nd (All Souls Day), something

unique takes place in many towns and cities: a festival is held which is called 'The Day of the Dead'.

While it's strange for most of us to accept the fact that "death" and "festivities" can go hand-in-hand, for most Mexicans, the two are intricately entwined.

This all stems from the ancient peoples of Mexico who believed that the souls of the dead return each year to spend time with and visit their living relatives - to eat, drink and be merry....just like they did when they were living.

On All Souls Day, adults who have died are honoured with displays of their favourite food and drinks, as well as ornaments and personal belongings being placed on their graves. Flowers, particularly orange marigolds, and candles also decorate the graves supposedly to guide the spirits home to their loved ones.

Other items include skull shaped sweets and a rich coffee cake decorated with meringues which are shaped like skulls; these sweet treats can be bought in all the shops and markets from mid-October onward. It really is seen as a time of celebration and thanksgiving for the lives of loved ones.







During this time, doors and homes are often decorated with colourful wreaths and bunting as above.



Fabric Report

Due to circumstances beyond our control, we were unable to meet the September deadline for grant applications, for work on the installation of the toilets and kitchenette at the back of the church. The delay was caused by various problems. Initially with the tenders, some of which had to be re done. This then delayed the faculty application with the diocese. WE are still waiting for their permission to be granted. We are hopeful to have the necessary information ready for the next grant application deadline in December. We would only hear if we have been successful in the spring of 2019. No work can commence until then. Once we have the faculty, we should be able to go ahead with the relocation of the font to the front of the church. Subject to us having sufficient funds to do so, the cost will be about £8000 plus vat, this work generally does not qualify for a grant, but the fantastic team at Halton Borough council are searching for some funds for us. 'Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven' – what will the world be like when this happens? What is God's will for us and this earth? What can we do [and what do we do] to 'do God's will' and make this world the same as it is in heaven? Well – that was an interesting discussion around the café church tables. How many of the things that work against this are related to 'possession', power and control? In the face of the task ahead we all need to stay motivated and persistent – not always easy. We were not downcast though. Faith, hope and love – like a multi-vitamin for the soul and spirit. And of course the reassurance from Christ himself...'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty'.

Yes, we can build the kingdom here, one step at a time. There's encouragement all around us

I keep a postcard in the front of my sermon book that a friend from St Bride's gave me. It came from the community of Aidan and Hilda in Lindisfarne. It says

'May the Christ who walks with wounded feet walk with us on the road.

May the Christ who serves with wounded hands stretch out our hands to serve.

May the Christ who loves with wounded heart open our hearts to love.'

Do you have special things that encourage you? Share them with someone – aside from being together in church and sharing worship, how much of our individual spiritual resources do we share?

We also don't always realise the 'history' or the connection of individuals to our church family. For instance, it feels like Joyce Brereton has always been at Cronton – and indeed she has been here a long time.

When Joyce moved to Cronton in 1964, her first child had already been baptised in Liverpool. Her two younger children were baptised at St Luke's [by Revd Corbett] and all three were confirmed there. (Joyce is on the right).



Joyce was a Sunday school teacher from 1965 – 1985 [or thereabouts - 20 years anyway]. She also managed to fit in the warden role at Cronton. Unless I have missed anyone out, only Caroline has now been at Cronton longer [she was born here, so a member all her life]. Back to Joyce – she has worked and worshipped with four vicars up to and including Revd Ray and joined the church when it was based in the old building on Cronton Road. It didn't just look like a church, it was easier to set up; the altar and altar rails were at the front behind a shutter during school hours. Joyce is still an active member of the church - on the committee, bringing flowers, doing teas... and if she didn't clean the brasses... well, enough said. The things that are not so visible to everyone, are the visits she regularly makes to Caroline, the care and attention she gives to those who need it - quietly, discreetly and without letting everyone know what pastoral care she is dispensing. She is important to so many people and I hope she knows how much she is appreciated. There are several other 'anchors' out there in the parish – you are all special to others for what you do and give, thank you all and bless you.

The contribution of Joyce and others like her reminds me...In a couple of café church sessions we have used a YouTube rendition of 'This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it shine' with an animated video and I just love this version – both the music and the visual ...lightbulbs with arms and legs that march in time to the music. It's in the Sunday school video series – check it out if you have




