‘Our Parochial Church Council (PCC) met last night and decided that Morning Prayer weekly services will resume in church starting on Sunday 19th July at 10.30am. The church will not be open on Wednesdays for 9.30am service.

Funerals may then be held in church on Wednesdays or Thursdays so there is at least 72 hours between each opening of church.

The services on Sundays and Wednesdays will continue to be Zoomed to your home as usual so it is your decision if you attend church or not. This is especially important for people in the vulnerable groups which include over 70s. Singing is not allowed in church so Paul will play and sing hymn from home. Masks are not (yet) mandatory but advisable.
